Appointments

The Graduate Writing Center (GWC) offers FREE 50-minute appointments with friendly, experienced writing consultants to all registered UCLA graduate and professional school students year round. Consultation appointments may be used for any academic or professional writing, including but not limited to:

course papers • articles and publications
abstracts • fellowship and grant application materials
thesis and dissertation drafts • proposal and prospectus drafts
oral presentations • strategies for written examinations
job applications • cover letters • personal statements

The goal of the GWC is to help you become an effective writer and communicator in your academic or professional field. Our writing consultants come from different disciplines, so you may select a consultant in a field close to yours or a consultant with experience in the type of document you are currently writing (see the writing consultant bios web page for more information). Writing consultants will work with you on writing issues ranging from organization and argumentation to grammar and style, but they will **not** proofread or edit your writing for you.
